For talking to the panel!

Be prepared! - If you can, spend time with your support worker preparing your question(s) and practice saying it out loud. This will help you get the confidence to speak in front of an audience. Speak slowly, clearly and (most of all) speak from the heart and you'll do great! If you are really worried about asking a question though, just email VAV (Brenda.saetta@ed.ac.uk) and we can ask it for you. Another way would be to ask your support worker to read out your question instead of you.

Use your voice! - Telling the panel yourself what young people need is far more powerful than if an adult speaks for you. Even if it's scary, remember that the members of the panel are people too and will be blown away by your bravery in fighting against domestic abuse! Don't forget that it's their job to listen to young people so that they know what changes need to happen.

Know your audience - All our panel members have their own special powers and areas of expertise e.g for Nicola Sturgeon it is what Government can do to help children affected by domestic abuse and for Harry McGuigan it is what local authorities can do. Check out our VAV panel cards to see if you want to direct your question to one panel member. It's fine though if you want to ask a question to all three!

Make it real, but be safe - Hearing your views is important for the panel, but make sure you're safe when asking questions, especially if you have any experience of domestic abuse. You don't need to use your own personal experience to illustrate your question. You also don't need to tell the panel

what your real name is or where you are from.
